## Proposed Heritage Declaration – the Sea Rights Yingapungapu

Thank you for your letter dated 3 May 2024 inviting us to make a submission in response to whether the Sea Rights Yingapungapu located at the Baniyala Homeland, Blue Mud Bay in northeast Arnhem Land should be permanently declared as a heritage place under the *Heritage Act 2011*.

The Aboriginal Areas Protection Authority (the Authority) is a statutory body established under the *Northern Territory Aboriginal Sacred Sites Act 1989* (Sacred Sites Act) and is responsible for overseeing the protection of Aboriginal sacred sites on land and sea across the Northern Territory. The protection of Aboriginal sacred sites is recognised by the Northern Territory Government and broader Territory community as an important element in the preservation of the Territory's cultural heritage for the benefit of all Territorians.

The Authority is supportive of declaring the Sea Rights Yingapungapu as a declared heritage place. The Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics (DIPL) holds an Authority Certificate over the area (C2009/092). The Authority Certificate is based on consultation with custodians and provides clear conditions about what can and cannot be done in and around sacred sites.

In particular, the Certificate identifies a Restricted Works Area (RWA) within Lot 109A which encompasses the Sea Rights Yingapungapu. the condition in the Authority Certificate identifies that no works are to occur within the RWA as there is a recorded sacred site 6171-35 (two 'knowledge' trees, a ficus tree and a casuarina tree) located adjacent to the sand sculpture memorial. Mr Djambawa Marawilli, a custodian recognised in the community has requested that permission should be sought from him or his nominated representative before any works are to be undertaken, so that they can be considered on a case-by-case basis.

The Authority therefore recommends that the Heritage Council apply for an Authority Certificate in accordance with section 19B of the *Sacred Sites Act* prior to undertaking any activities in the subject area of Lot 109A.

This should not impact the heritage declaration.
